A Letter of Encouragement to Parents from our Bishop:

Dear Parents,

Bishop James V. Johnston recently sent a pastoral letter to parish ministry workers addressing many important topics. One of them I found to be expressly meant for you as parents, and I wanted to share a piece of it with you, given the nature of it and how it honors you as parents in the role of catechesis for your children when you first became parents and baptized your children into Christ's life.

Here's a snippet of it:

"The Irreplaceable Role of Parents

The transmission of faith is accomplished from person to person. This personal aspect is especially relevant in the context of family, which is the *domestic church* in our Catholic understanding. The family forms the most basic cell of the Church. As a small society of faith and love, every family member has rights and duties. The pinnacle of Christian parents' responsibilities, which they promise to fulfill on the day of their child's baptism, is to educate and raise their child in the Catholic Faith. Indeed, one of the Catholic Church's foundational principles for religious education is that parents hold the primary place as educators of their children. All the other resources the larger Church community provides- the parish school, religious education programs, and youth ministry- are meant to supplement what happens in the child's family, not replace it.

Empowering Parents

With the irreplaceable role of parents in mind, this new initiative supports more direct involvement of parents in their children's ongoing Christian education and spiritual growth. The hope and expectation are for this to contribute to the ongoing spiritual development of parents as well. God delights when the family grows together, each member contributing to the holiness of the other. Research shows that children who grow up discussing faith within the family are more likely to practice their religion ten years after they leave home. More than any other factor- a family that regularly discusses faith has the most influence on children continuing to practice their faith."

Words of blessing, honor, and encouragement from the Bishop expressly for you, dear parents! I hope this emboldens your call to proclaim the Gospel to all nations, starting in your own home. I also hope that we can prayerfully discern and integrate this teaching into our catechesis program and parish family here at Our Lady of Lourdes!
